#### DESCRIPTION OF CHANGE OR EXTRA WORK:

- Item #1 Additional construction services to complete the replacement of Gate WW-17 and to coordinate accordingly with existing Contract A construction items.
- Item #2 Additional construction services to complete the revised construction of Odor Control Heating and Condensate Drains and to coordinate accordingly with existing Contract A construction items.
- Item #3 Additional construction services to complete the additional construction of Primary Sedimentation Tank Effluent Gates and to coordinate accordingly with existing Contract A construction items.

#### REASON FOR CHANGE OR EXTRA WORK:

- Contract A to include additional construction services to install new Gate WW-17 located between the Primary Effluent Conduit and the Primary Bypass and Junction Chamber. Installation of Gate WW-17 provides the ability to operate the plant during Primary Bypass and Partial Treatment modes, including controlling flow to the secondary treatment system. Construction items include inspection and measurement of the existing frame and concrete, fabrication of Gate WW-17, and installation and associated testing of Gate WW-17. The Gate WW-17 scope was initially part of the upcoming Primary System Rehabilitation and Upgrades Contract B project. Due to bid advertisement delay of Contract B, it is necessary to move the installation of Gate WW-17 into Contract A to improve plant operations during Primary Bypass and Partial Treatment operation modes. Gate WW-17 is critical to be installed as soon as possible to ensure safe and dry working conditions during the Primary Sedimentation Tank repair work.
- Item #2 Contract A to include additional construction services for the revised design of the Primary Sedimentation Tank Odor Control Equipment. Construction items include heat tracing insulation, control and power wiring for odor control equipment interconnections, and additional accessories including drains and associated tunnel connections. These additions to the new odor control system will improve year-round operation to treat odorous air from the Primary Treatment System.

Item #3 Contract A to include furnishing and installation of four slide gates at the Primary Sedimentation Tank Effluent Conduits to provide isolation of the required Primary Sedimentation Tank rehabilitation work awarded previously with Contract A. Construction items include adjustments of walkable odor control covers, removal of concrete fillets to receive gates and frames, concrete preparation work for the associated area, and fabrication and installation of the manually operated slide gates. The Primary Sedimentation Tank Effluent Gates, in conjunction with new Gate WW-17, will provide the ability to isolate flow in the Primary Sedimentation Tank Effluent troughs, allowing the contractor to isolate each tank to install new equipment, repair existing concrete and apply new protective coatings to extend the life of the concrete. In addition, the new Primary Sedimentation Effluent Gates will provide BSA staff flexibility for future maintenance of the tanks.
